

SAFETY CULTURE

Safety is a shared responsibility, and every employee has a role in maintaining a safe working environment.

- Shared responsibility ensures everyone contributes to safety.
- Collective vigilance prevents hazards from going unnoticed.
- Actively speaking up about hazards promotes a culture of safety.
- A safe working environment benefits all employees.

If you see a hazard or unsafe act then fix it, do something, or report it, but do not ignore it.

- If you see an injury or incident occur, report it immediately.

If you aren't sure if you should report something, be cautious and go ahead and report it! Small issues can lead to tragic consequences if they are not addressed promptly.

- Proactive reporting fixes minor hazards that have the potential to cause significant property damage or critical injuries if they are left unchecked.



- By actively engaging in continuous improvement and fostering a proactive safety culture, you contribute to a safer and more efficient work environment for everyone.
- If everyone is fixing or reporting hazards, then others don't have to guess if it's appropriate to do so because it just becomes part of the positive safety culture on the job.
- Collaborate with coworkers to ensure that everyone is adhering to safety procedures and supporting each other to maintain a safe place to work.
- Share any new hazards you identify with your team to raise awareness.
- Suggest practical solutions for recurring safety issues during team meetings.
